Following Principal Industries' acquisition of SloanLED, the San Angelo Headquarters needed space to expand. In the first quarter of 2023, the EDD was able to secure them 20,000 sq ft of industrial space. This expansion will allow the Principal Sloan-San Angelo site to increase output capacity by 15%, with new equipment and increased headcount (15 new jobs), and new in-house production eliminating their need to purchase finished goods from the European and Asia-Pacific regions.

AERMOTOR WINDMILL SCHOOL

Aermotor Windmill Company, Howard College, and the San Angelo Chamber of Commerce, Economic Development Department completed the Spring 2023 class bringing in learners from around Texas (Wills Point, Tulia, Childress, Cisco, Dripping Springs, Rio Grande City, Lampasas, Santa Elena, Odessa, Baytown, and Marfa), and from way up in Edgemont, SD. As a result of this initiative, Aermotor has acquired 5 new customers, and initially increased sales by over \$16,000.











FABRICATORS RECRUITMENT DAY

This year's event doubled student participants from the previous year, with students from SAISD, TLCA and Robert Lee. There was a total of six employers present - ALNC Inc Steel Fabrication, Dragon Industries, Heare Services, Long Industries Inc., Wendland Manufacturing and Western Towers.







ETHICON ENGINEERING PATHWAY SYMPOSIUM

San Angelo ISD partnered with Ethicon, Inc. a Johnson & Johnson MedTech Company and a leading medical device manufacturer located here in San Angelo, TX, (a partnership facilitated and nurtured by the San Angelo Chamber of Commerce Economic Development Department) to offer an opportunity for high school seniors to explore careers in the STEM2D pathway. Ethicon announced students who completed the STEM2D symposium series could apply for a \$20,000 scholarship and internships at Ethicon. Ethicon selected TWO winners! One from Central High School and one from Lake View High School – each were be awarded \$20,000 scholarships.









TEXAS CAREER SIGNING DAY

This event was part of a nationwide celebration showcasing the impact Career & Technical Education programs have on addressing the U.S. skills gap. San Angelo ISD was one of thirteen independent school districts that registered events with the Texas Workforce Commission. This is about celebrating our future workforce and highlighting the job stability and healthy quality of life the trades and technical careers can provide. CTE Career Signing Day was made possible through a partnership between SAISD's CTE Department, San Angelo Chamber of Commerce's Economic Development Department, Concho Valley Workforce Development Board, Howard College, Home Builders Association of San Angelo and Texas Workforce Commission.









REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

The Chamber of Commerce Economic Development Department was instrumental in helping Dorado Construction Group create the area's first Registered Apprenticeship Program since 1993, and it is currently the only active program in San Angelo and Tom Green County.
